- Psychosocial support & mental health

WHO

Young Mentor Mothers

WHERE

- Health facility
- Home
- Community

HOW

- Case Management of mother-baby pairs
- Supervision by HCWs and Zvandiri
- Peer-led education and counseling
- Home visits
- Support groups
- mHealth
- Linkage and referrals
- Defaulter tracing

Results in 38 sites implementing the project (24 months)





96% of the young mothers have undetectable viral loads



97.6% of exposed infants are HIV negative

2.4% MTCT rate at the end of breastfeeding

Successes in Engaging Men (24 months)

- 65% of YMs reported a partner
- 92% of male partners tested for HIV (the first time for most)
- 66% partners identified with previously undiagnosed HIV.
- 99% partners who tested HIV-positive were initiated on ART
- 98% who tested HIV-negative subsequently linked to PrEP.
- Improved disclosure by YMs to their partners



Lessons learned/ Next steps



- Peer-led MTCT interventions are highly effective in preventing vertical transmission of HIV
- Same model improves engagement of male partners for
 - Partner testing
 - PrEP
 - Condom use
 - Improved support for YMs
- Need to continue scaling up the YMM intervention; with emphasis on intervention for partners



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
