The CQUIN Learning Network

- The HIV <u>Coverage</u>, <u>Quality</u>, and <u>Impact Network</u> is a south-to-south learning network designed to accelerate implementation of high-quality differentiated service delivery to enhance patient outcomes, increase health system efficiency and achieve HIV epidemic control
- Funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation
- Convened/led by ICAP at Columbia University
- Advisory Group inclusive of Ministries of Health, civil society, PEPFAR, CDC, USAID, WHO, Global Fund, UNAIDS, International Treatment Preparedness Coalition (ITPC)
- Supported by a Community Advocacy Network chaired by ITPC
- Focuses on the gap between policy and implementation










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- Differentiated service delivery tailors the design of HIV programs for different groups in order to meet their needs and expectations and to deliver high quality services
- Optimizing HIV services for diverse key population groups is critical to ensure the coverage, quality and impact of HIV services
- Key strategies include KP-led services, statusneutral care and integrated, holistic service delivery models



Illustrative pre-meeting needs assessment findings (N = 15 countries)




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Illustrative pre-meeting needs assessment findings (N = 15 countries)

Barriers to providing DSD for KP





Illustrative Registration Survey findings (N=297 respondents)

- HIV prevention, testing, linkage and treatment services for KP are not yet implemented at scale.
- M&E of KP services remains challenging: only 33% of respondents said that KP services are captured by national M&E systems
- 91% of respondents said that hostile legal, social and/ political environments limit KP access to HIV services in their countries

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Meeting Design

- Meeting design is based on two needs assessment surveys and 40 key informant interviews with a wide range of KP representatives, recipients of care, ministries of health, implementing partners and global experts.
- The meeting is co-convened with the South-to-South HIV Prevention Learning Network (SSLN) which is coordinated by Genesis Analytics and the University of Manitoba and includes 10 of the 21 countries in the CQUIN network







Meeting Objectives

- Present basic concepts, conceptual frameworks and global guidance related to differentiated HIV testing/linkage, prevention, and treatment services for KP groups.
- Center the voices and experiences of KP-led organizations and recipients of care.
- Review case studies and best practices related to DSD models for KP across the spectrum of HIV services.
- Collaboratively explore crosscutting barriers and facilitators to DSD for KP
- Discuss strategies for KP program monitoring and evaluation
- Identify common gaps, challenges, and opportunities for future joint-learning, co-creation of tools and resources, and future south-to-south exchange visits.

Collaboration will continue after the workshop, as the two networks support ongoing south-to-south exchange, communities of practice, and joint learning.




Meeting Logistics
