
Zambia: CQUIN Dashboard Staging 2017-2021



Change in Dashboard Domains since 2020


- Remained consistent in most domains

 - Significant progress made as 2021 data was accessed from the national system




Zambia: Differentiated Treatment Model Mix

2021 Goals and Targets



By CQUIN's 5th annual meeting (end-2021):

- Address the M/E challenge
- Initiate advanced HIV Disease Management in men 25-44 years
- Increase DSD ART coverage for;
 - Children 2-14 years
 - Men 15-35 years
 - MCH/PBFW
 - Adolescents
- Plans to increase DSD HIV Testing coverage for;
 - Children 0-14 years
 - Men 15-35 years
 - MCH/PBFW
 - Adolescents
- Update the 2018 DSD National Framework to include; testing and prevention

Update on CQUIN Action Plan (1)

Successfully completed activities

- M&E addressed
- Increase DSD coverage for children 2 -14 years
 - ○Based on evidence the team expanded the eligibility criteria for stable recipients of care to include children 2 – 14 years
 - Memo generated and disseminated countrywide

Update on CQUIN Action Plan (2)

- No activity has been dropped
 - All activities committed in 2021 are ongoing and are focus areas for 2022-2024
- Engagements on how to adopt and adapt the 'mentor mother model' for national implementation
- Revised DSD Framework almost concluded.

Update on CQUIN Action Plan (3)

The team in collaboration with GF/WHO, a local and international partner is implementing:

- HIV Community Post Model that focuses on finding men, who will then be linked to parent facilities that have established men's clinics.
 - AHD screening services will be conducted at Community Post with referral to the men's clinic OR the next level of care for treatment

COVID-specific adaptations

- Aggressive scale up of 6MMD for stable ROCs
- Anticipated to be sustained beyond COVID19

Successes

- Operationalization of the DSD M&E Framework into the national system
- Consistent virtual monthly DSD Task Force meetings
- On-going DSD trainings across the country
- Scale up of pediatric MMD, especially 3MMD
- Integrating IPT into Differentiated Service Delivery Fast Track pilot model has been adopted for scaleup in 5 high volume facilities in the country.
 - Pilot Manuscript



Challenges (other than COVID-19)

 DSD national data only accessible at central level by the MoH Information, Communication, Technology (ICT) unit
