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

Introduction

- A country with 25 million inhabitants
- HIV prevalence 2.7% (DHS,2018)
- 491,834 PLHIV (spectrum 2020 projections)
- 370,011 PLHIV on ART (S1 report, NACC)
- Mixed epidemic:
 - Generalized & concentrated in key populations
 MSM:13.0%, FSW: 11.6%, TG:12.7%, IDU: 8.2%
- Pregnant women HIV seropositivity 2.9%
- Exposed infants HIV seropositivity 4.3%

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

Update on CQUIN Action Plan


- Activities that have been successfully completed include:
 - DSD focal person identified and a taskforce created to pilot DSD strategy development and implementation.
- One or two activities that were dropped or is still underway include:
 - The country is capitalizing on GF HIV DSD SI to develop an operational manual, JOBAIDS, M&E tools and a scale up plan.
 - Quality norms and standard for DSD currently being defined (despite quality not in the action plan)

Update on CQUIN Action Plan (MMD targets)



- We are on track with our 2021 targets for MMD.
- Due to supply chain challenges our MMD policies are restrictive,
 eligible mainly for displaced
 military and PLHIV in crises zones

Update on CQUIN Action Plan (Model mix targets)



Were any items added to the action plan midyear

- After the Differentiated MNCH meeting in May 2021?
 - Already stable women to continue multi-month dispensation during pregnancy
 - Reinforce mother and child pair follow up in postpartum
- After the Differentiated KP services meeting in August 2021?
 - Scale up HIV testing services for Key Population
 - HIVST

COVID-specific adaptations

- Three to four policies adapted in response to COVID19
 - Coordinating meetings using virtual platforms
 - Training of health care providers through virtual platforms
 - Promote continuous respect of barrier measures for staffs and patients
 - Online commands and stock monitoring
 - Reinforcement of community dispensation models and ARV
- Which of these will be sustained beyond COVID19?
 - Coordinating meetings using virtual platforms
 - Online commands and stock monitoring of HIV commodities
 - Reinforcement of community dispensation models and ARV

M&E adaptations made in response to COVID19 and new DSD policies adapted to enhance data reporting

- Transmission of monthly reports of health facilities through virtual platforms (WhatsApp)
- Monthly virtual coordination meetings with the regional M&E team to follow up implementation of Activities.
- Online monitoring and management of HIV commodities at the peripheral and regional levels.
- Weekly virtual clinical program and data review with facility staffs.


Successes

- DSD national coordination
- Harmonization of DSD models nomenclature
- Availability of DSD data through collaboration with PEPFAR implementing partners
- Integration of DSD in national care and treatment training
- Follow up of PLHIV through virtual platforms (Whatsapp)
- Defining Norms and standards of Quality for DSD

Challenges (other than COVID-19)

- Implementation of DSD models with respect to regional specificities
- Unavailability of sufficient stock to sustain MMD
- Difficult to capture DSD data at non-supported sites

Opportunities 2022



- GF HIV DSD SI → Development of Operational guide, tools, JOBAIDS
- WHO SI TA → To support Coordination of DSD activities as well as provide technical support to NACC
- CDC/PEPFAR → Allocated funds to support
 DSD activities across the health pyramid
- CQUIN → Technical Assistance, Knowledge sharing, South to south visits.

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2022 Goals and Targets – 1

By CQUIN's next annual meeting (end-2022):

- 50% of people on ART will be in less-intensive DSD treatment models
- Plans for model mix: Through the GF HIV DSD SI we intend to review DSD models across the 3 (95s) to improve access to testing, improve retention and VL testing for children and young adolescents (0 14years).

Decentralize coordination of DSD;

- Regional coordination DSD committee
- Site level coordination of DSD to improve ownership

2022 Goals and Targets - 2

- Plans for AHD services?
 - Evaluation and implementation of AHD dashboard
 - Reinforce data collection to capture PLHIV in advanced disease.
 - Home based follow up for Advanced disease patients who are not hospitalized.
- Plans for differentiated MNCH services?
 - HIV/Syphilis duo testing
 - Reinforce HIV services for pregnant and breastfeeding AGYW
- Plans for differentiated HIV services for mobile, migrant and/or displaced people?
 - Standardize models to improve assess to care for mobile and migrant populations

2022 Goals and Targets – 3

- the one most important DSD-related goal or target in your country's plans for 2022
 - Development of Operational Guide, Development of DSD data collection tools and integration into national M&E system
