What is the Pediatric and Adolescent Client Audit Tool?

It is a hand tool that provides clients' summaries to aid the clinic staff in quickly identifying, planning, and providing **targeted comprehensive service delivery** to the paediatric and adolescent recipients of care at their next visit to the facility or community service point.







The goal of the tool is to improve client centered-service delivery for pediatric clients to achieve viral suppression

- It is applied to all recipients of care to determine their status along the HIV care cascade
- Identify the service needs and prepare for the clinic
- Provide targeted comprehensive services based on need (services flagged RED! in the audit tool)



- The tool has four sections:
- 1. A "Read Me" Guide on how to use the tool
- 2. The child and adolescent audit tool section
- 3. Indicator summaries
- 4. Summary Results table





The Pediatric and Adolescent Audit Tool Section

This section has information on client status on the following:

- Demographics and breastfeeding status
- Index testing of siblings/children
- Index testing of partners
- Current regimen details
- Viral load and optimization
- Services for unsuppressed, including intensive adherence counseling, HIV DR testing, switching
- TPT and TB screening
- PSS and MMD status
- DSDM approach, the status of treatment, next appointment date
- Follow-up outcomes
- OVC enrollment status
- CHW attachment status and community appointments
- Number of services required




The Summary Results Table

This section provides tables and charts for the clinic on various indicators, including scheduled appointments, pediatric clients seen, clients who missed their appointments, and clients who received all services





How to use the tool to improve services and clinical outcomes?



Why use the Pediatric and Adolescent Client Audit Tool?



✓ Its user friendly

- Does not need a skilled person to complete or use it
- Usable in facilities without EMR or electricity
- No multiple coding forms involved
- Is a hand-tool/dashboard for the actual care provider/CHW (clinical team not IT personnel)
- Aids the service provider to provide targeted services for each client by:
 - Identifying clients' care needs for the stated visit, e.g., VL test, TPT, MMD, IAC, Index testing, optimization, follow-up, etc.
 - Informing the service provider to offer all care needs to the clients at once during the appointed visit day
- Gives a quick, wholesome and detailed summary/dashboard of the client's status and hence easing planning, e.g., drug orders, report summaries, especially performance review meetings
- Assists the Supervisors/coaches/mentors to identify gaps in the care cascade so as to support sites address them
- ✓ Strategy to supporting overall viral load suppression



What is the current status of utilization of the Audit tool?

✓ Tool is used in all 70 health facilities supported by TASO in the

Acholi sub-region in Northern Uganda

✓ Tool has been scaled-up for utilization across the country

- ✓ Continued progress to have it linked to the EMR
- ✓ Tool has been expanded from pediatrics to other technical areas

including adults, PMTCT-EID, and KP/PP
