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





### CQUIN Testing & Linkage Capability Maturity Model – Pilot Staging Results






#### Differentiated Treatment Model Mix

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### Country Level Planning and Coordination

### Platform used for planning/coordinating DSD activities

- C&T/HTS/PrEP Technical Working Groups/DSD Subgroup
- Led by the Prevention and C&T Branch Chiefs and DSD Coordinator

#### Coordination meetings held in the past year

- 8 coordination meetings were held in the past year
  - 2 virtual TWG meetings to discuss DSD for Prevention
  - 3 virtual TWG meetings to discuss DSD for C&T
  - 1 DSD TWG in person meeting
  - 2 in person workshops
    - Civil Society attended all meetings.



### Country Level Planning and Coordination

### Update on CQUIN Action Plan from the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting (2021)

### Activities that have been successfully completed:

- Update of the DSD training package
- Development of a package of DSD communication material for demand creation
- Developed and piloted AHD registration and reporting tools
- Added 2 DSD impact indicators in our QI PDSA cycles to be able to report retention and VL suppression indicators

### **Activities that are still underway:**

Development of an in-service DSD training package for lay providers



### Other important activities

#### Activities that have been successfully completed:

- National phased scale-up of HIV self testing
- 2<sup>nd</sup> DSD Performance Review
- Update of the new DSD Guide and its training package
- Training of trainers on implementation of the new DSD package
- Development of DSD demand creation materials

#### **Activities that are still underway:**

- Implementation of QI Cycles, where DSD indicators are included
- Update of the M&E and QI DSD indicators on our monthly feedback reports
- Update of the "DSD AJUDA dashboard" data flow, to include the provincial level




#### **Lessons Learned**



**Demand Creation Materials** 

### Challenges

- 1. Lack of a Health Information System which allows routine DSD Data report
- 2. Weak integration of family planning services into MMD models
- 3. Overlapping activities: Many activities ongoing at the same time.
- 4. Low HF coverage during DPR (18/1736). Data must be interpreted carefully.
- 5. Quality of services provided to RoC enrolled on LIM (Not all standards met)
- 6. Equipment and Commodities for AHD

Implement a DSD demand creation campaign

Engagement of lay providers on implementation of DSD

Reinforce engagement with Private Sector




### DSD priorities for 2023 (2/2)
