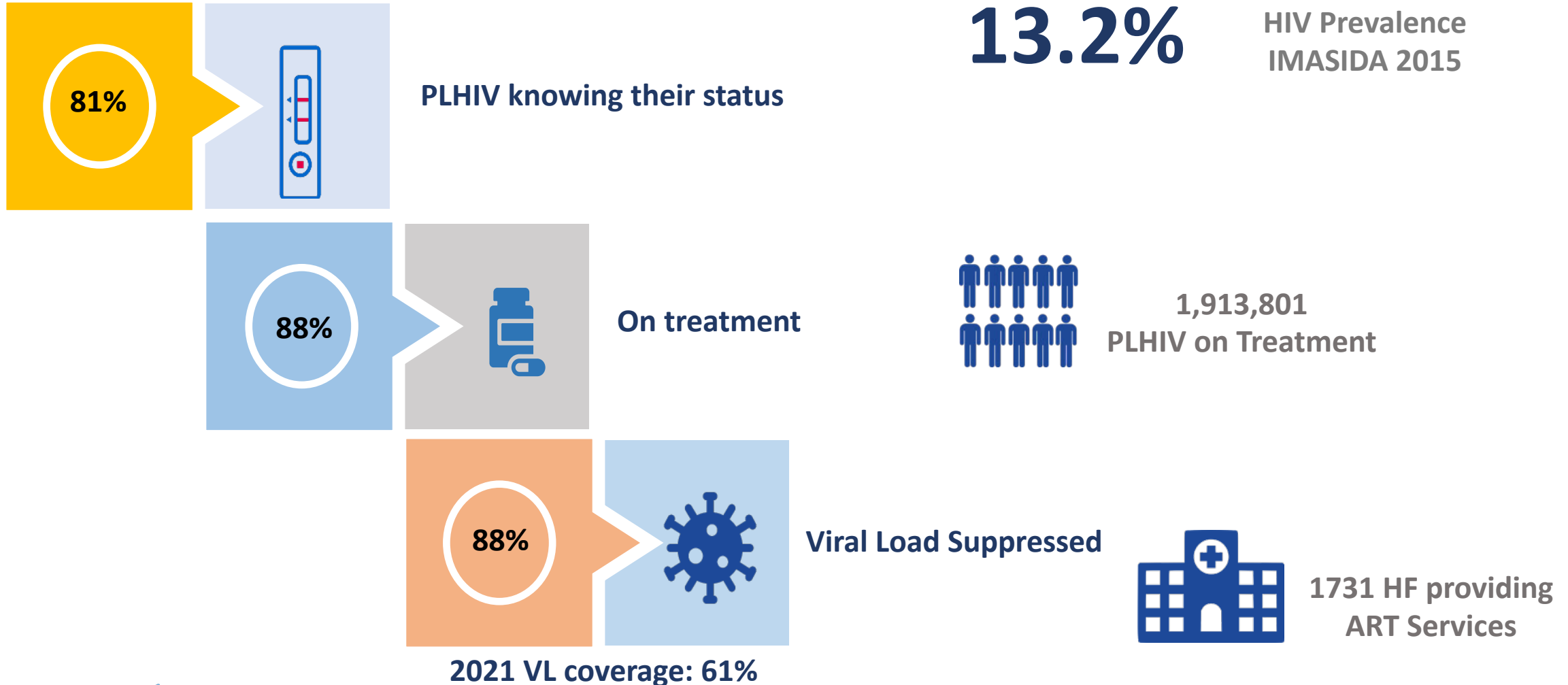

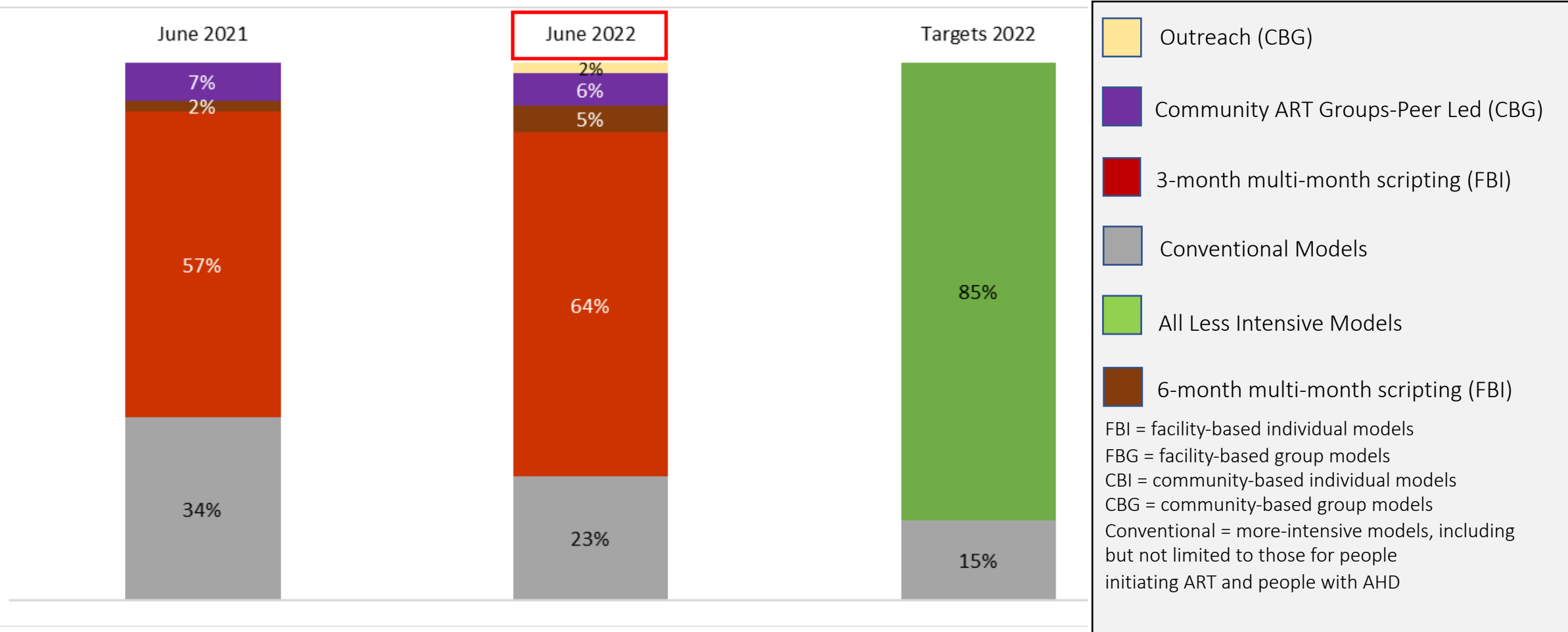
Mozambique 2022: CQUIN Treatment Capability Maturity Model Staging Results



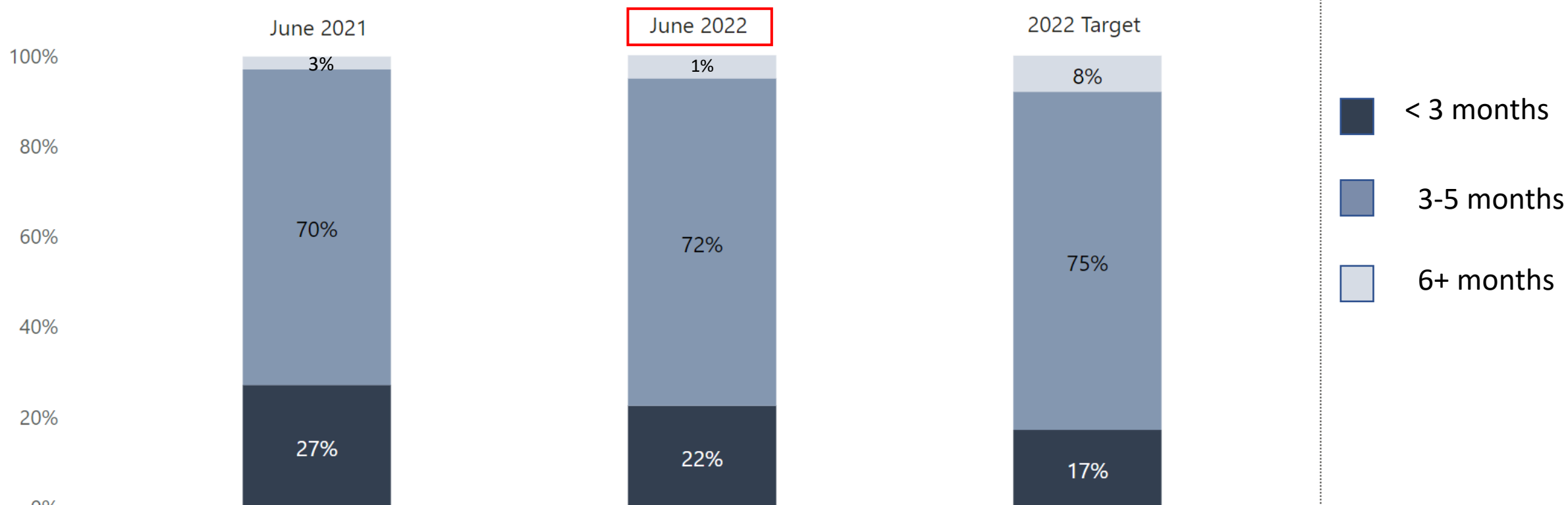

Platform used for planning/coordinating DSD activities

- C&T/HTS/PrEP Technical Working Groups/DSD Subgroup
- Led by the Prevention and C&T Branch Chiefs and DSD Coordinator

Coordination meetings held in the past year

- 8 coordination meetings were held in the past year
 - 2 virtual TWG meetings to discuss DSD for Prevention
 - 3 virtual TWG meetings to discuss DSD for C&T
 - 1 DSD TWG in person meeting
 - 2 in person workshops
 - Civil Society attended all meetings.

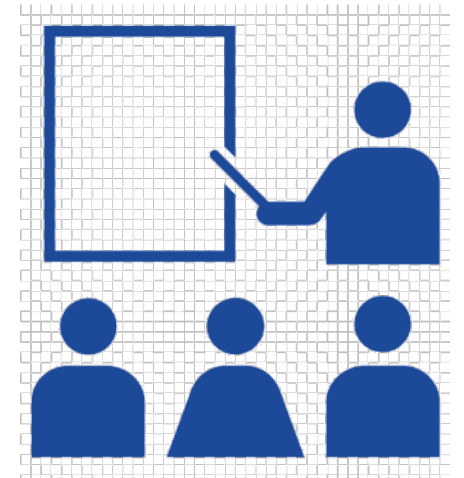
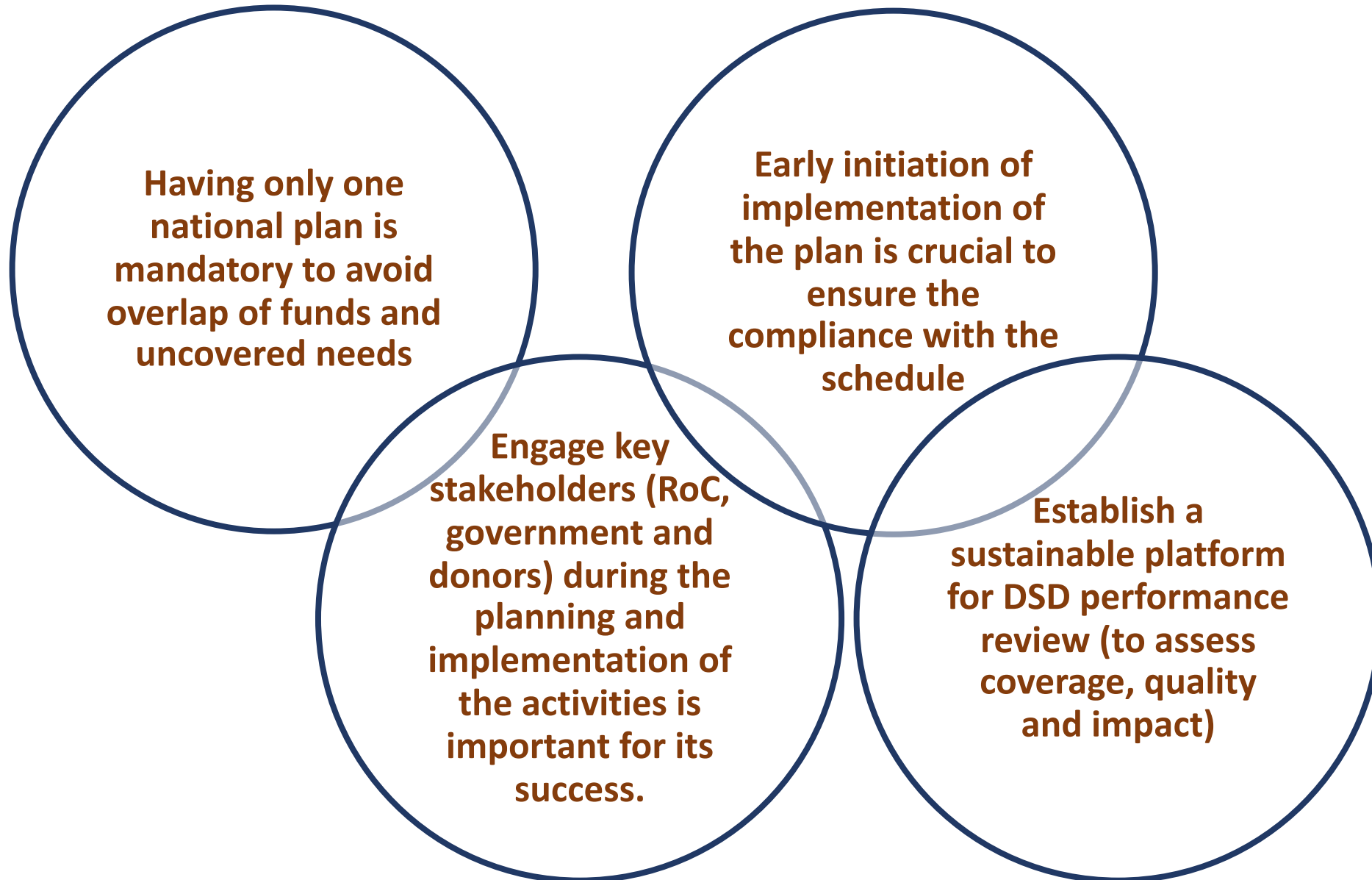

Demand Creation Materials

Challenges

- 1. Lack of a Health Information System which allows routine DSD Data report**
- 2. Weak integration of family planning services into MMD models**
- 3. Overlapping activities: Many activities ongoing at the same time.**
- 4. Low HF coverage during DPR (18/1736). Data must be interpreted carefully.**
- 5. Quality of services provided to RoC enrolled on LIM (Not all standards met)**
- 6. Equipment and Commodities for AHD**
