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






Progress towards the 95:95:95 targets







- Lesotho attained 90:96:91 in 2020 (LePHIA2020)
- Low ART and VL Coverage (<90) by June 2023
- Significantly high testing yield, higher among males (12%)


Most mature domains

Least mature domains

Maturity in 8/19 (42%) of domains – DG and LG, currently working to improve on the least mature domains



CQUIN Treatment Dashboard Results: Change Over Time



- Notable progress in the following five domains:
 - Policies, diversity, coordination, KP and TB/HIV domains
- Maturity sustained in four domains:
 - Guidelines, facility coverage, client coverage and P&SCM
- Status quo in the following domains:
 - Scale-up plan, community engagement, training, M&E
 System, quality, impact, AHD,MCH&FP domains
- Currently, in the process of developing DSD operational guidelines, and updating M&E tools



Differentiated Treatment Model Mix



- Coverage for clients on DSD for less intense models (LIM) improved from 93% in 2022 to 96% in 2023 (mainly due to improved documentation)
- Tools have been revised to capture the different LIM from next year



Differentiated Treatment: Multi-month Dispensing



- 70% of clients are in 3-6 MMD as of June 2023
- M&E tools revised to align with WHO categories (<3MMD, 3MMD, 6MMD)
- Others (includes 4,5 and > 6 all together)

Most mature domains

Least mature domains

- Eight out of 18 (44%) of the domains are mature or dark green / green
- M&E system does not capture ALL coverage data at national level, hence orange score
- Insufficient information available to estimate client coverage 1, but available coverage data for facility, and client coverage 1&2 is between 25-49% of eligible RoCs/facilities
- The updated M&E tools will facilitate improved reporting of national level coverage

Most mature domains

Nine out of 22 (41%) of the domains are mature

- Currently implementing dHTS action plans developed in March 2023
- Prioritized domains this year include M&E, scale up plan, and private sector engagement



Least mature domains

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Country Level Planning and Coordination

- DSD activities are coordinated in the country by the HIV/TB TWG
- There were no meetings specifically for DSD however, during the joint TB/HIV strategic plan development (April-August 2023),
 DSD activities were discussed during writing meetings.
- Different recipient of care organisations were represented including LENEPHWA, LENASO, MANTSOPA Institute etc.
- Activities funded by PEPFAR
 - o Procurement of glucometers and BP machines for health facilities in 8 districts
 - Inclusion of the DSD agenda under COP23
- Activities funded by Global Fund
 - Development of Health sector HIV/TB strategic plan that has DSD strategic objectives.
 - Revision of HIV and AIDS patients monitoring tools to include integrated indicators on DART models, NCD and Mental Health in the National M&E system
 - Printing of M&E tools
- Process used to prioritize these action plans
 - Activities prioritization involving all the stakeholders
 - The Ministry of Health and PEPFAR implementing partners were involved in the COP23 prioritization processes

Update on Country Action Plan from the 6th Annual Meeting (2022)

Activities that have been successfully completed include:

- 1. Development of Health Sector Strategic plan that includes DSD strategic objectives
- 2. Procurement of glucometers and BP machines for health facilities in 8 districts
- 3. Inclusion DSD agenda under COP23
- 4. Revision of HIV and AIDS patients monitoring tools to include integrated indicators on DART models, NCD and Mental Health integration into National M&E system
- 5. Training of data personnel on revised tools

Activities that are still underway include:

- 1. Development of the DSD manual
- 2. Development of national DSD scale up plan
- 3. Training of healthcare providers on DSD models and implementation
- 4. Distribution and operationalization of revised tools

No activities were added to the action plan mid year



Integration of HIV and Non-HIV services into DSD

- Integration policy adopted during the year
 - The new strategic plan includes integration of FP, Mental health, and other NCDs
- Major barriers in the country against scale up of integrated services
 - Commodities for NCDs
 - Lack of skilled health workers (Mental health)
 - Need for in-service training for HCWs on management of NCDs
 - M&E systems do not routinely report integration data at national level
- Activities being implemented to scale up integration of FP and NCDs into DSD models
 - Procurement of glucometers and BP machines for health facilities in 8 districts
 - In-country discussions on integration of services are on going
 - Updating M&E tools to record and report data on integration



DSD Implementation Successes in 2023

- Initiated discussions to classify existing DSD models
 - Various community models exist but are not being reported
 - M&E tools are being reviewed to capture these models
- Revision of M&E tools means Lesotho will be in position to report on a detailed model mix, and coverage rates
- Scale up of EMR to more ART sites provides an opportunity to access de-identified patient level data at national level



Challenges in DSD Implementation

- Lack of clear definitions on DSD models
- Not all DSD indicators included in national M&E system
- Currently the national M&E system is not able to provide de-identified patient level data at central level



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DSD priorities for 2024

DSD-related goals and/or projection for 2024

- Finalization of DSD manual
- Development of national DSD scale up plan
- Training of health care workers on DSD models and implementation
- National roll out of revised M&E tools

What we want to learn from other countries in the CQUIN network in 2024

- Facility and community-based DSD
- Meaningful engagement of recipients of care
- VISITECT implementation for AHD
- KP programming
- M&E of DSD
