

Most mature domains

Least mature domains

- 58% (11/19) scoring of LG & DG most mature domains
- 32% (6/19) scoring of orange and red -least mature domains
- Need to bridge gaps in M&E of DSD, AHD, MCH, FP, Service delivery to KPs, and TB/HIV




Differentiated Treatment Model Mix and Targets



- Model mix has been diversified with the introduction of Community ART Delivery
- Although targets for community drug delivery and conventional models were not met, there was an overall 10% increase in the proportion of clients in less intensive models since 2022, exceeding our 2023 projection



Differentiated Treatment: Multi-month Dispensing



• MMD was further scaled up from the 2022-2023 period with a 6% increase in 6MMD and 4% increase in 3-5MMD

- The baseline AHD CMM shows maturity in most of the enabling domains
- Significant gaps were found in the impact domain, client coverage, diagnostic capability, and the quality of AHD services
- Some enabling domains such as scale-up plan, policies and M&E systems also need improvement

• Gaps in private sector oversight, clinical services, M&E, and linkage to treatment/ prevention have been prioritized to be addressed due to their current scores and interventions are in place towards progressing in the impact domains

Update on Country Action Plan from the 6th Annual Meeting (2022)

• Activities that have been successfully completed include:

- 1. Re-orientation of healthcare workers on Differentiated HTS and ART Service Delivery
- 2. Conduct of Advanced HIV Disease Prevalence Survey
- 3. Build capacity of ROCs (NAP+) on DSD and HIV Care Guidelines

• Activities that are still underway include:

- 1. Update KP SOP to include detailed DSD implementation guides for all KP groups
- 2. Mobilize resources for Community-Led Monitoring
- 3. Update dART and dHTS scale-up plans

• Activities that were deferred include:

- 1. Roll out of DSD-friendly data collection tools
- 2. Development of a comprehensive AHD implementation plan
- 3. Add testing to the electronic tracker



Integration of HIV and Non-HIV services into DSD

DSD Implementation Successes in 2023

- 1) Conducted all the CMM Stagings (Testing, Treatment, AHD)
- 2) Developed and piloted Differentiated HIV testing Service Quality assessment tool
- 3) Conducted Ghana's first DSD Performance Review
- 4) Participated in a country-to-country learning exchange visit to Mozambique on HIV-FP integration
- 5) National launch of HIV self-testing service (with online delivery component)
- 6) Updated the HIV Testing Register to be compliant with status-neutral testing approach
- 7) Addition of DSD-specific activities to GC 7 grant for GF funding



Challenges in DSD Implementation

- 1) Funding gaps to implement DSD activities to scale
- 2) Human resource gaps at all levels of client care and for NCD integration
- 3) Competing priorities donor priorities affecting timely intervention delivery



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DSD priorities for 2024

- 1) To roll out new DSD-friendly M&E tools
- 2) To secure GF Resources to support DSD initiatives(e.g., DPR) in GC7
- 3) To learn how to programmatically integrate key non-HIV services into HIV care
- 4) To make significant strides on the three CQUIN CMM dashboards
- 5) To improve supportive supervision for DSD using the Service Quality Assessment tool
- 6) To play an active role as a CQUIN Member Country and contribute to the growth of the network.
