

dHTS CMM development, staging, and CoP launch (2021-2023)





To a greater extent, dHTS policies and/or guidelines are in place creating an environment favorable for dHTS implementation and easy scale-up of evidence-based practices



Gaps in policies, guidelines, implementation, and M&E of dHTS contribute to immaturity of impact domains

dHTS CMM-Lessons from the staging results

- Varying levels of maturity from country to country
 - Opportunity for cross learning
- Shared challenges on some domains e.g., Linkage to prevention, M&E, Private sector engagement, implementation and scale-up plan
 - An opportunity for the co-creation of tools, resources
- Staging results provide a baseline upon which performance progress will be tracked for the next 5 years

From staging to action planning: QUIN dHTS meeting, March 2023

- CMM results informed the agenda of the first CQUIN dHTS meeting, in March 2023
- During the meeting, each country team developed/refined a national action plan, which included:
 - Priority domains/challenge areas
 - Requests for country-to-country exchange (including in-person visits)
 - Requests for TA
 - Suggestions re: resources/success stories they can share with other countries
- Country teams validated their action plans-final plans were shared with CQUIN
- Country priorities informed activities and plans for the dHTS community of practice



Top Priorities (in order of frequency)

Country Action Plans:

- 1. Linkage to prevention
- 2. Differentiated mobilization
- 3. Linkage to treatment
- 4. Implementation/scale-up plan
- 5. Private sector engagement
- 6. Testing for re-engagement (rediagnosis)

Country-to-Country Visits:

- 1. M&E of dHTS
- 2. Triple elimination
- 3. HIV self-testing
- 4. Linkage to post-test services
- 5. Private sector engagement
- 6. Social network testing services

Webinars:

- 1. Status neutral testing
- 2. Use of digital platforms
- 3. HIV self-testing
- 4. Linkage to prevention
- 5. M&E of dHTS
- 6. Target-setting for dHTS

Shared Challenges

- Reaching key populations, men, and young people
- Engaging recipients of testing services
- Linkage to prevention
- Expansion of HIVST and social network testing services
- Implementing re-testing for verification
- Documenting linkage (to prevention and treatment)
- Documenting *time* to ART initiation after diagnosis
- Lack of disaggregated testing data for population groups
- Oversight of / engagement with private sector HTS

"Our national testing strategy is not adequate: the objective is to have everywhere a 3-test strategy, including dual HIV/syphilis test for ANC and eventually KP"

"Linkage to prevention for negative clients - MOH does not collect this data for all the prioritized populations, so we need to learn from others who are doing this well, or brainstorm with other countries on how best to holistically look at linkage to prevention."

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dHTS CoP activities since inception

- Launch of the dHTS CoP on May 9
- 3 CoP calls on Linkage from Testing to HIV Combination prevention services
 - Call 1- July 13:
 - Availability of policies and guidance on **Linkage from HIV testing** to combination prevention services
 - Call 2- August 31:
 - **Best practices for implementing Linkage from HIV testing** to combination prevention services
 - Call 3- October 99:
 - ❖ Monitoring and Evaluation of **Linkage from HIV testing** to combination prevention services
- C2C visit related to dHTS:
 - Cameroon and Cote D'Ivoire visit to Senegal on HIV-Syphilis Duo
 - Mozambique to Malawi on Testing of Re-engagement-planned for the week of Nov 20th
- Focused TA: E.g., TA to Uganda to develop a dHTS implementation and scale up plan
- Ongoing TA to countries to implement their action plans



dHTS CoP Areas of focus (2024)

Based on country action plans, C2C requests, and webinar priorities:

- Linkage to combination prevention
- M&E of dHTS
- Social network testing services (in collaboration with KP CoP)
- Strategic planning (scale-up plans, target setting)
- HIV self-testing
- Private sector engagement
