

Zambia dHTS CMM results – 2023 vs 2024




Positive shifts [upgrade in the staging]:

- Finance/Resource Allocation- There has been clear articulation and evidence-based financing and resource allocation towards the HIV testing program.
- Further, the revised implementation plan does include clear interventions and budget lines identified.
- M&E, Proficiency testing, linkage to treatment, verification testing, optimizing HIV testing, community engagement, coordination.
- Community Engagement Community members are involved in the evaluation of the dHTS and take part in most of the meetings.



Zambia dHTS CMM results – 2023 vs 2024...cont



Positive shifts [upgrade in the staging]:

- Linkage to treatment The country has identified priority populations for testing. With engagement with the NAC, we have some data that indicates that of the tested, more than 75% are linked to treatment.
- Negative shifts [down grade in the staging]: dHTS training and linkage to prevention
- Domains that remained stagnant:
 - Knowledge of Status The country has identified priority groups for testing but does not have national data to determine what proportion of each priority group's awareness of HIV status

Key Lessons Learned over the Past Year – Facilitators and Barriers

Barriers/Challenges

 The cholera outbreak that the country experienced made it difficult to implement planned activities

Facilitators

- Stakeholder coordination and active participation from IPs was instrumental in achieving the milestones
- CQUIN Webinars- Participation in the dHTS crosscountry calls was helpful for programming e.g. sharing country experiences in the HIV status neutral approach
- C2C Visits Zambia's visit to Nigeria on the implementation of caregiver-assisted HIV selftesting



Engagement with CQUIN and other Stakeholders on dHTS

- Actively participated in the dHTS community of practice calls
- Technical support received from CQUIN during the pre and post 2024 dHTS CMM self-staging
- Budgetary support from CQUIN for the dHTS staging meeting
- CQUIN Webinars- Participation in the dHTS cross-country calls was helpful for programming e.g. sharing country experiences in the HIV status neutral approach
- C2C Visits Zambia's visit to Nigeria on the implementation of caregiverassisted HIV self-testing

- The role of HIV testing in clients' re-engagement into care

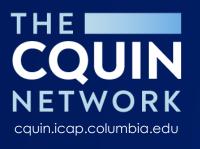
