Introduction

- HIV sexual partners job aid is a tailored job aid designed to facilitate open and supportive conversations during HIV counseling sessions in consultation rooms
- It aims to help healthcare providers and nurses identify and counsel individuals living with HIV to disclose and address their sexual contacts in a friendly and non-judgmental manner.
- It is available as a printed poster for easy access during counseling sessions.



Key features and benefits

Key features

 Local names and terms for sexual partners, ensuring cultural relevance and sensitivity.

Benefits

- Helps reduce stigma and shame associated with discussing sexual behavior, encouraging honest and open dialogue.
- Facilitates comprehensive risk assessment and partner notification, leading to better HIV prevention and care outcomes.
- Strengthens the client-provider relationship and enhances client satisfaction with counseling services.









Sexual partners index case testing, before and after implementation




Conclusion

- The implementation of this job aid has resulted in a substantial increase in tracked and tested contacts, improving the case identification, especially among sexual partners.
- The development of the job aid supported clinicians and counsellors in reaching a higher number of contacts, specifically sexual partners of index cases, through a visual resource and accessible language.
- ICAP will continue to monitor and support the health units in implementing strategies to reach more contacts for identifying additional cases, using the index case strategy.
- ICAP will present the strategy and it's results to the National MOH HTS TWG to consider its adoption as a national tool
