

- Lesotho scored Dark Green in 10 domains, and Light Green in 4 domains.
- Less mature domains include the two linkage and two impact domains; in addition, M&E, population coverage, coordination, and policies on optimizing HIV testing, which have been prioritized in the 2024/2025 action plan

#### **Observations**

- Improved in 7/21 domains such as financing, scale up plan, private sector engagement, supply chain, and linkage to Rx: verification
- Regression in the coordination domain from Light Green to Yellow caused by a reduction in the number of coordination meetings attended by community representatives
- Quality domains: EQA/IQC, Proficiency testing, Clinical testing were mature
- 2024 action planning will tackle linkage,
   M&E, and population coverage domains



## Key lessons learned over the past year – facilitators and barriers

#### **Facilitators**

- 1. Strengthening the policy environment
  - **Review of guiding documents:** 
    - National health sector strategy
    - DHTS Guidelines review process underway
- 2. Stakeholder engagement
  - CQUIN for TA (physical and virtual)
  - **❖ PEPFAR, GF, etc. for TA and funding**

#### **Barriers/Challenges**

- 1. Lack of survey data to determine coverage for some KP segments
  - IBBS to include transgender and PWID populations
  - 2. M&E system not capturing all HTS indicators
    - DHIS2 upgrade is ongoing
  - **3. Ambitious action plans:** Time did not permit to implement all prioritized actions


