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
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


Kenya Progress Towards the 95:95:95 Targets June 2024

Children Cascade




While the overall performance for the 1st 95 is high; Coverage for children remains low at 72%; 72%; 66%


Kenya Treatment CMM Results: 2024



- Overall: 12/19 domains achieved light and dark green in the 2024 staging
- Increased facility DSD coverage; due to ongoing efforts of HCW capacity, utilization of data, engagement of ROC
- DSD quality indicators now included as part of the integrated national service quality assessment
- Increased program investments on AHD and integration of services; expected improvement in results




Kenya DART Treatment CMM Results Change Over Time 2022-2024



- Overall, there has been significant improvement in the diversity and coverage of DSD models over the years
- A total of 12/19 domains achieved maturity of light and dark green in 2024 compared to 11/19 in 2023
- In the last one year, there has been increased prioritization of AHD and integration of NCD, SRH and other non-HIV services; expected to translate into results in subsequent years
- Ongoing efforts are being undertaken to utilize national M&E systems to measure impact




Kenya Differentiated Treatment Model Mix



- Appointment spacing + Fast Track (FBI)
- **CBI** = community-based individual models
- **CBG** = community-based group models
- **Conventional** = more-intensive models, including but not limited to those for people initiating ART
- Representativeness of data refers to the percentage of the current treatment cohort
- Client coverage of less-intensive DSD models remained almost the same 69% (2023) and 68% (2024)
- Facility based less-intensive models are predominant (61%) in the country
- In the last year there has been efforts to increase diversity of models including roll out of community DSD models

Kenya Differentiated Treatment: Multi-month Dispensing



 Overall improvement of coverage of >3 months multi-month dispensing from 76% (2023) to 82% (2024); following the launch and dissemination of the Kenya HIV guidelines 2022 and stability of treatment commodities

- Overall: 11/18 AHD domains achieved light and dark green in the 2024 staging
- National AHD sub-committee meetings held on a bi-weekly basis this year: finalization of AHD implementation plan and AHD/OI manual, updating of training of HCWs, set up of AHD Hub-Spoke/Centers of Excellence
- Country has also set up an AHD M&E Dashboard; critical in measuring AHD performance, impact
- AHD quality indicators included integrated national SQA



- Overall improvement/progression towards more mature domains
- A total of 11/18 domains (61%) achieved maturity of light or dark green in 2024 compared to 7/18 (39%) in 2023
- Overall coordination through AHD sub-committee this year as well increased involvement of ROC has been key towards AHD implementation
- The Kenya AHD implementation plan has been developed; key interventions to address gaps include CD4/diagnostic optimization, capacity of HCWs
- Established AHD EMR dashboard; plans to leverage on this to assess quality and impact of AHD
- Better data visualization has been critical for improved staging of client coverage domains as well as expansion of services following the launch of guidelines 2022 and training
- There were stock outs of some key AHD commodities regression on supply chain domain.

- Improvement noted across eight (8) domains between the dHTS CMM of 2023 & 2024
- Kenya has currently rolled out the WHO recommended 3-test algorithm for HTS
- Country has continued prioritizing the domains that have stagnated, and key actions identified in the CQUIN dHTS meeting - July 2024

Overview of HIV Program 2024 CMM Results

- Strong enabling domains across all the program areas
- Through the national TWGs working with all stakeholders to synergize interventions
- The Country is currently using the integrated national quarterly performance reviews (QPR) and the integrated DQA/SQA as key platform to improve program outcomes
- Leveraging Kenya EMR/digital solutions for measuring impact of interventions




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Stakeholder Coordination and Prioritization Processes



 DSD coordination is through the national TWGs and established sub-committees; recipients of care represented

Funded activities:

- PEPFAR: DSD coordinator/TA at national program, national TWGs, AHD sub-committee meetings, DSD manual finalization
- Global Fund: NCD/PEN package development, scale up of Community pharmacy model, Community CAGs, AHD trainings
- WHO/CHAI: Finalization of AHD implementation plan and AHD/OI operational manual for HCWs
- All stakeholders involved during COP & GC-7 planning; prioritization through the national TWGs and AWP process

Update on Country Action Plans from 2024 Meetings

- Activities that have been successfully completed include:
 - **CQUIN annual meeting:** Quarterly review of AHD M&E Dashboard, Hub-Spoke model, mapping of CD/diagnostics, finalization of DSD operational manual, EMR visualization of DSD data & quarterly review
 - Integration meeting: Identification of focal persons, coordination structure at MOH, mapping of integration models
 - dHTS Meeting: inclusion of quality indicators for dHTS in SQA
- Activities that are still ongoing include:
 - CQUIN/Annual Meeting: DPR using NDWH, implementation of Community pharmacy
 - Integration: Development of simplified NCD/PEN /packages for HCWs
 - dHTS: Development of scale up plan, updating EMR to capture longitudinal linkage to prevention
- Activities that were dropped include:
 - DSD quality assessment these have been integrated in the national DQA/SQA



Update on Integrating Non-HIV and HIV Services



- The Ministry of Health through NASCOP held the first integration summit in June 2024 - best practice sharing and developing rethinking integration strategy
- Coordination:
 - Set up of Integration and Health Systems Strengthening Committee that coordinates integration, Reactivation of the HIV-TB-Co-morbidities TWG, Assignment of focal persons, Representation of the 2 divisions in respective national TWGs, Communities part of the TWGs
- Bi-weekly learning forum from Counties: sharing of experiences in integration
- An integration framework is being developed that will include integration strategy/metrics, defining models, sustainability



Program Sustainability Efforts and Opportunities

Sustainability of DSD activities


- DSD performance reviews integrated in national Quarterly Performance Review (QPR)
- AHD, dART/DSD quality indicators included as part of national integrated DQA/SQA
- Leveraging on EMR for future DSD performance reviews
- DSD/AHD part of national TWGs agenda

National sustainability roadmap

- DSD part of larger conversation on HIV sustainability; including integration of services to routine care
- HIV care/DSD leveraging on Government of Kenya initiatives primary health care (PHC), Social Health Authority (SHA)



DSD Implementation Successes in 2024



- Increased facility uptake of DSD and implementation of AHD package of care
- Finalization of national DSD manual
- Integration of DSD as part of integrated national quarterly performance review, DQA/SQA
- National AHD coordination of AHD; including progress in establishing AHD Centers of Excellence, finalization of implementation policy documents, EMR AHD dashboard
- Scale up of interventions for HIV/NCD integration

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DSD Priorities for 2025

DSD-related goals and/or projections in plans for - 2025

- Scale-up of Quality AHD Package by expanding access to a quality AHD care package in all facilities, utilizing a hub-and-spoke model
- Work with the Division of Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) to finalize and disseminate the Package of Essential NCD (PEN) interventions, specifically within the context of HIV care
- Utilize the Electronic Medical Record (EMR) system and national Monitoring &
 Evaluation (M&E) system to assess the impact of AHD services
